Re: "Measuring Developed Land Pilot Study"

Dear Ms. Vandenberg:

The League is now in possession of a study entitled, "Using Parcel Based Data to Improve the Accuracy of Measuring Developed Land at the County Level." ("Pilot Study.") It is our understanding that this study was conducted by the National Center for Neighborhood and Brownfields Redevelopment at Rutgers University and provided to the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH) on July 9, 2008. The report, using Somerset County as a control, indicates that the vacant land analysis utilized by COAH includes a significant percentage error.

On October 22, 2008 the League submitted an OPRA request to COAH, a copy of which is provided. This "Pilot Study" was not provided to us as part of this request. It is clear and undebatable that this study should have been provided to us in response to this request. Further we note that we requested that if the agency believed that any of the information requested was privileged and/or confidential, that the agency provide an appropriate privilege log. We were not provided with such a log.

Since the "Pilot Study" was provided to COAH staff before the Council took action on the amended regulations on September 22 it appears that the Council members were unaware of this study when they voted to adopt the revised regulations.

Since this study discredits COAH's vacant land analysis and methodology, we must ask the following:

- 1) Why was the League not provided a copy of this report in response to our October 22 OPRA request? Further, why was this report not made available to the public?;
- 2) Was this study ever made available to the COAH Council members? If so, when was it made available?;
- 3) Is COAH in possession or aware of any additional reports, studies, analysis or other type of documentation that were designed to test the accuracy of the various consultants reports that were used to create the COAH regulations?

We consider this a very serious matter. The League filed its brief on January 5, 2009. We cannot help but wonder if this study was not provided to us so we could not use it in our legal challenge of the regulations. Further, we are dismayed that local governments and taxpayers have funded the preparation of plans, incorporating a land analysis that the agency knew as long ago as July contained significant error.

We would appreciate a timely response to this letter.
