**INTERLOCAL SERVICES AGREEMENT FOR
EMERGENCY "911"/POLICE DISPATCHING SERVICES**

This Agreement entered into this 23rd day of January, ~~2005~~²⁰⁰⁶ by and between:

THE BOROUGH OF HIGHTSTOWN, a municipal corporation
of the State of New Jersey with offices at 148 North Main Street,
Hightstown, New Jersey 08520 ("Borough")

and

THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY, a municipal corporation
of the State of New Jersey with offices at 23A North Main Street,
Cranbury, New Jersey 08512 ("Township")

WHEREAS, the Borough has radio transmitter equipment known as KVV-724 used in connection with the functions of its Police Department and dispatchers operating same; and

WHEREAS, the Township has a Police Department and is desirous of using the equipment and services of the Borough for emergency "911"/police dispatching services, including fire and first aid; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is willing to provide such services to the Township upon certain terms and conditions;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration for the mutual promises of each of the parties, it is agreed as follows:

1. The Borough will provide emergency "911"/police dispatching services and will answer all emergency telephone calls coming into the Township's Police Department, and will dispatch all police, fire and first aid calls for the Township on a 24-hour-per-day basis. Specifically, the Borough shall:

- a. Accept and promptly transmit emergency calls for police, fire, ambulance, and official municipal vehicles and activate sirens, alarms or other emergency signals as necessary.
- b. Provide "911" emergency and computer-assist dispatch system services..
- c. Furnish reports of activities.
- d. Monitor private alarm installations, if and when such facilities are established, at the expense of the owners and dispatch emergency units in response.
- e. Obtain emergency license number information for Cranbury from the New Jersey Division of Motor Vehicles.

2. The services provided for this Agreement shall be performed by personnel to be hired, paid and supervised by the Borough, and said personnel shall use the physical facilities of the Borough. The Borough and the Township agree that, in order to assist and cover the Township for "911" emergency services, the Township agrees to share the cost of said dispatchers.

3. The following shall apply to radio equipment used in connection with emergency "911"/police dispatching services:

a. The control of all radio transmitters installed in vehicles owned by the Township shall be under the jurisdiction of the personnel of the Township.

b. This contract in no way affects the present ownership of the radio equipment of either the Borough or the Township.

c. No one except a person or person designated by the Chief of Police of the Township shall in any way attempt to service or alter the radio equipment.

d. The radio equipment will be protected at all times from improper use and abuse, subject to the provisions 10.154 and 10.254 (b) per 10 FCC rules and regulations. (Transmitters to be used only in an emergency that would require cooperation or coordination with Police activities.)

e. It is further agreed that, in the event of violation of this contract by the Township, the Borough shall cause the transmitter to be deleted from inclusion in license KVV-724, and service to be discontinued.

4. The term of this Agreement shall be from January 1, 2006, to December 31, 2008.

5. In consideration for the Services rendered by the Borough, the Township agrees to pay the Borough the sum of:

For period January 1, 2006 – December 31, 2006	\$ 105,850.00
For period January 1, 2007 – December 31, 2007	\$112,200.00
For period January 1, 2008 – December 31, 2008	\$118,950.00

in accordance with the following schedule:

6. This contract becomes effective upon the adoption of a resolution by each municipality pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:8A-1, et. seq.
