

THE FOLLOWING BILLS WERE ENACTED AS THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 2014:**Chapter 15 S-2279 6/30/2014**

Reinserts in FY 2015 Appropriations Act language that was omitted due to a technical problem.

Chapter 16 S-837 7/2/2014

Requires State Agricultural Development Committee to establish pilot program permitting special occasion events to be conducted on preserved farmland at wineries under certain circumstances.*

Chapter 19 A-1676 7/30/2014

Provides that crime victims do not have to pay fees to obtain records relating to the crime and that requests for such records are not public information.*

Chapter 28 A-3266 8/1/2014

Establishes Equipment Loan Program in NJ Environmental Infrastructure Trust; changes submission and approval requirements for financial plan.

Chapter 31 S-946 8/11/2014

Implements constitutional amendment providing for pretrial detention of certain criminal defendants; establishes non-monetary bail alternatives for release; authorizes Judiciary to revise fees for certain legal programs and services.*

Chapter 32 A-1999 8/11/2014

"The Opportunity to Compete Act;" establishes certain employment rights for persons with criminal record.*

Chapter 34 S-942 8/15/2014

Provides standards for, and requires registration of, home elevation contractors.*

Chapter 35 S-1229 8/15/2014

Authorizes fine for failure to maintain certain vacant properties; requires out--of-state creditors to designate in-State representative.

Chapter 47 A-1314 9/10/2014

Creates the option to make a voluntary contribution for the support of local libraries on gross income tax returns.

Chapter 52 A-1794 9/10/2014

Limits when bidders can be required to submit a financial statement in order to bid on a local public contract or county college contract.

Chapter 53 A-2025 9/10/2014

Grants immunity from liability for certain professional services rendered during emergencies under certain circumstances.

Chapter 54 A-2280 9/10/2014

Requires certain police vehicles to be equipped with cameras.

Chapter JR-3 SJR-45 8/5/2014

Designates June as "New Jersey Arts, Culture, History, and Tourism Month."
