THE FOLLOWING BILLS WERE ENACTED AS THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 2011:

Chapter 52 S-1392 4/20/2011

Requires State-administered pension systems to train employers on enrollment requirements; requires employers to certify validity of employee enrollment with acknowledgement of penalty for providing false information.

Chapter 53 S-1712 4/20/2011

Requires hospitals to report certain injuries to local and State police.

Chapter 55 S-2465 4/20/2011

Permits combination of voter petitions and application by municipal governing body for approval of Municipal Consolidation Study Commission by Local Finance Board.

Chapter 56 A-2032 4/20/2011

Permits certain members of Junior Firemen's Auxiliaries to perform non-hazardous support duties at fire sites.

Chapter 65 A-3272 5/4/2011

Requires State-administered pension systems to train employers on enrollment requirements; requires employers to certify validity of employee enrollment with acknowledgement of penalty for providing false information.

Chapter 69 S-2562 5/9/2011

Requires hospitals to report certain injuries to local and State police.

Chapter 70 S-1730 5/17/2011

Permits combination of voter petitions and application by municipal governing body for approval of Municipal Consolidation Study Commission by Local Finance Board.

Chapter 71 S-2065 5/17/2011

Permits certain members of Junior Firemen's Auxiliaries to perform non-hazardous support duties at fire sites.
