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THE FOLLOWING BILLS WERE ENACTED AS THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 2019:

Chapter 66 **A-4999** **4/29/2019**

Requires filing of certain creditor contact information with residential mortgage foreclosure complaint and lis pendens.

Chapter 67 **A-5001** **4/29/2019**

Revises statute of limitations for residential mortgage foreclosures.

Chapter 68 **A-5002** **4/29/2019**

Permits certain planned real estate developments to file certain liens; concerns limited priority of certain liens.

Chapter 70 **S-3416** **4/29/2019**

Clarifies that "New Jersey Residential Mortgage Lending Act" applies to certain out-of-state persons and involved in residential mortgage lending in the State.

Chapter 72 **S-3413** **4/29/2019**

Makes certain changes to summary action foreclosure process under "Fair Foreclosure Act."

Chapter 76 **S-368** **5/2/2019**

Authorizes political subdivisions to set aside 0.5 percent of public works fund to recruit and train women and minorities and promote local hiring.

Chapter 79 **A-4897** **5/2/2019**

Permits 20 year ferry boat local public contracts; permits 50 year local public contracts for certain capital improvements and extends prevailing wage requirements to certain work performed under those contracts.
